World Lymphedema Day, March 6, 2019: Regional Healthcare Facilities Feature Free SOZO® Screening Events for Early Detection of Subclinical Lymphedema

Free lymphedema screening events in North Carolina and Kentucky, March 6!

In recognition of World Lymphedema Day this March 6, ImpediMed is pleased to support the lymphedema screening events being held at WakeMed in North Carolina and Baptist Health Paducah in Kentucky.

These screening opportunities feature free SOZO screenings to help measure, monitor and manage lymphedema in patients who have had cancer surgery or another surgery that impacts the lymphatic system.



What Is Lymphedema?

Lymphedema occurs when a clear lymphatic fluid builds up in the soft tissues of the body, usually in a limb, causing a painful and debilitating tightness and swelling of one or both arms or legs. Up to 10 million Americans, and hundreds of millions worldwide, suffer from lymphedema and lymphatic diseases. More people suffer from these diseases in the United States than suffer from multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy, ALS, Parkinson's disease, and AIDS -- combined.

ImpediMed is working alongside industry colleagues in March to shine a light on this devastating condition related to the effects of cancer treatments. For cancer survivors -- particularly many women who have undergone a mastectomy and/or radiation treatment in the fight against breast cancer -- lymphedema can be devastating.

SOZO makes screening a quick, easy process for both patients and care teams.

- Therapy for lymphedema
- Fitness and nutrition for lymphedema
- Mammography
- The WakeMed Breast Cancer Surgery Program
